Heffernan's paintings offer a wonderful excess of color and content in surreal portraits and landscapes packed with sly arthistory references. "Self Portrait Two-Headed Queen" comfortably features two separate bodies wearing just one enormous, ruffled dress, with mice spilling from it. "Self Portrait with Flower Skirt" alludes, in its belt of miniature wildlife, to the charmed nature scenes nearby, where lobsters sun themselves by mountain waterfalls. Heffernan gives the greedy viewer echoes of French and Italian masters and the flash of contemporary interpretation at once but refuses to satisfy the desire her mimicry arouses for perfect detail and finish.
