In this article we bring you a selection of 10 opening exhibitions from around the world. Our list includes the second solo exhibition of Cristóbal Lehyt, Iris Sheets II: This Time It's Personal, at Johannes Vogt Gallery in New York, a show marrying photography, painting and abstraction by artist Joshua Dildine at Mark Moore Gallery in Los Angeles, the photographer Alex Prager's first solo museum show in the United States at the Corcoran Gallery of Art, Mythos Welt that focuses on the two main German Post-Expressionist artists, Max Beckmann and Otto Dix at Kunsthalle Mannheim, and Existence Without Air, Food, Or Water by Cheng Ran at Galerie Urs Meile in Lucerne, Switzerland.

Mark Moore Gallery proudly presents <u>Joshua Dildine</u>'s inaugural showing in the main exhibition space. At the intersection of abstraction and photography, <u>Dildine</u> uses seemingly mundane imagery from family photography as a backdrop to his painterly gestures and forms. Romantic artists broke free from the constraints of the state-run art academies and embraced a world that celebrated creativity and individuality. Fascinated by the exotic, artists traveled to distant lands; intrigued by the past, they journeyed back in time; and in search of the sublime, they reveled in the majesty of nature. read more...

Alex Prager: Face in the Crowd at Corcoran Gallery of Art Downtown - Washington D.C., DC, USA Nov 23, 13 - Mar 09, 14



For ten years, Los Angeles artist <u>Alex Prager</u> has staged imaginary scenes for her camera—dream worlds in Technicolor, rife with tension and melodramatic fictions. Deftly blending archetypes from post-war America, her images have re-enacted and burlesqued media portrayals of women, drawing from classic Hollywood movies, fashion advertising, and icons of documentary photography. Face in the Crowd, Prager's first solo museum show in the United States, presents her latest body of work by the same title. <u>read more...</u>

Stan Douglas | Disco Angola at Victoria Miro Gallery London, UK Nov 26, 13 - Jan 11, 14



Victoria Miro Mayfair is delighted to present Disco Angola by <u>Stan Douglas</u>, the artist's second solo show with Victoria Miro and his first at our new Mayfair gallery. In Midcentury Studio, Douglas' first exhibition with Victoria Miro, monochrome photographs were created in the guise of a mid-twentieth century Canadian press photographer. In the case of Disco Angola the artist assumes the persona of a fictional photo-journalist living in the mid 1970s and documenting two very different worlds: the nascent disco underground in New York and the civil war in newly independent Angola. <u>read more...</u>

Jason Martin: Painting as Sculpture at Lisson Gallery, Milan Milan, Italy Nov 22, 13 - Jan 10, 14



For his sixth solo show with Lisson Gallery, British artist Jason Martin presents a new series of cast copper and nickel works. Trained as a painter in oil and acrylic, Martin began manipulating his chosen material in the early 1990s, dragging, scraping, combing, raking and squeegeeing paint across the surfaces of his canvases and aluminium panels until their edges bled colour and the surfaces picked up textures, gestures and happenstance along the way. This performative process has been complicated in this latest set of cast works, available exclusively through Lisson Gallery, in which thick impasto marks made from brusque, almost baroque sweeps of hand-sculpted material have been solidified into metal in the manner of traditional bronze sculptures or statues, read more...

Cheng Ran: Existence Without Air, Food, or Water at Galerie Urs Meile, Lucerne Lucerne, Switzerland Nov 22, 13 - Jan 18, 14

After three exhibitions at the gallery in Beijing, <u>Cheng Ran</u> is being introduced to a Western audience with his first solo presentation at Galerie Urs Meile in Lucerne. In hi4 x 13 cm), the artist again takes up motifs and quotes from his earlier works; thus, the novel can be read as a subtext for this exhibition.
